

REDIRECTABLE PROBLEM BEHAVIORS

Problem Behaviors	Definition
<i>Minor Academic Dishonesty</i>	Reproducing another person's work, whether published or unpublished; submitting as the student's own any exercise prepared totally or in part by another; allowing another person to alter or revise the student's work substantially and submitting it as his/her own; using another's written ideas or works without properly acknowledging the source; attempting to submit materials taken from Internet sources without following proper research procedures and providing proper acknowledgment
<i>Impolite/disrespect</i>	Talking back and/or socially rude interactions
<i>Horseplay</i>	Non threatening physical interactions
<i>Inappropriate Language to Student</i>	Non threatening non directed verbal or gestural messages used within conversation that include swearing or use of words in an inappropriate way towards another student
<i>Lying</i>	Student delivers message that is untrue
<i>Misconduct</i>	Intentional behavior causing an interruption in class or activity. Disruption includes loud talk, noise with materials or body parts, or getting out of seat
<i>Tardy to class</i>	Student is late to class without a pass
<i>Unprepared for Class</i>	Student did not bring appropriate materials to class, e.g. homework

INFRACTIONS

Infraction	Definition
<i>Abusive/Inappropriate Language</i>	Threatening verbal or gestural interactions with peers or staff that are directed toward someone including swearing, name calling, or use of words or gestures in an inappropriate way
<i>Bomb Threat/ False Alarm</i>	Student delivers message (electronically, verbally, gesturally) or orchestrates the delivery of a message of possible explosive materials being on-campus, near campus, and or pending explosions; student pulls or orchestrates pulling of an unwarranted fire alarm
<i>Cell phone/Electronic devices</i>	Possession of/or using a cell phone or other electronic devices (e.g., MP# player, etc) during the school day
<i>Cutting/Truancy</i>	Unauthorized missing of an assigned period or activity or failing to report to school
<i>Disruption/Gross Disrespect</i>	Behavior causing an interruption in a class or building activity where the student is not responsive to repeated directions. Disruption includes sustained loud talk, yelling, or screaming; noise with materials or body parts; roughhousing; and or sustained out of seat behavior
<i>Dress code violation</i>	Wearing attire inappropriate as per dress code
<i>Excessive Absences</i>	Six unexcused absences
<i>Excessive Lates</i>	Five lates to school
<i>Fighting/Physical Aggression</i>	Actions involving serious physical contact where injury may occur (e.g., hitting, punching, hitting with objects, kicking, hair pulling, scratching, etc.), involves 2 people
<i>Forgery/Theft</i>	Student is in possession of, having passed on, or is responsible for removing someone else's property or has signed a person's name without that person's permission or has used identifying information from another person.
<i>Harassment</i>	Student delivers disrespectful messages (electronically, verbally, or gesturally) to another person that includes threats, intimidation, obscene gestures, pictures, or written notes. Disrespectful messages include negative comments based on race, ethnicity, disability, religion, gender, age, national origin, and or sexual orientation.
<i>Inappropriate Sexual Contact</i>	The inappropriate act of exposing and/or fondling the genitals of oneself or others and/or participating in sexual relations
<i>Insubordination</i>	Refusal to comply with staff directions
<i>Major Academic Dishonesty</i>	
<i>Missed Detention</i>	Unauthorized missing of detention
<i>Misuse of pass</i>	Using a pass other than it is intended. Student found in inappropriate area.
<i>Physical Assault on a student</i>	Intentional aggressive actions (e.g., hitting, kicking, throwing objects at, pushing, etc) directed at a student
<i>Physical Assault on a teacher</i>	Intentional aggressive actions (e.g., hitting, kicking, throwing objects at, pushing, etc) directed at school personnel
<i>Property Damage / Vandalism</i>	Student participates in an activity that results in substantial destruction or disfigurement of property
<i>Property Misuse</i>	Unauthorized and inappropriate use of school property including technology (e.g., downloading of software, sites, pictures, etc; changing computer settings; or providing personal information to web sites)
<i>Sexual Harassment</i>	Including but not limited to verbal abuse of a sexual nature, pressure for sexual activity, remarks made with sexual and/or demeaning implication, and unwelcoming touching
<i>Snowball throwing/Water pistol</i>	Possession and/or shooting/throwing a snowball or water pistol
<i>Use/Possession of Drugs, Alcohol</i>	Student is in possession of, caught using, or under the influence of illegal drugs or alcohol
<i>Use/Possession of Tobacco</i>	Student is in possession of or caught using tobacco products
<i>Use/Possession of Weapons</i>	Student is in possession of knives or guns (real or look alike), or other objects readily capable of causing bodily harm, or creating the impression (as in the case of a fake gun or grenade) of causing bodily harm
